How to Write Instructions

1. Write in the present tense.

2. Use imperative verbs and adverbs to begin each step. (*Imperative verbs are instruction or 'bossy' verbs – they tell you to do something eg. pour, weigh, put etc.*)

3. Use numbers to sequence the steps/instructions.

- 4. Use topic words.
- 5. Create clear and concise simple sentences.

How To Plant A Sunflower Seed

What you need:

- •A small pot •Soil
- •Seeds
- Watering canWater

What you do:

- 1.Fill the pot with soil to just below the top.
- 2.Add a little water to the soil.
- 3.Gently press one or two seeds into the soil.
- 4.Cover the seeds with a small amount of soil.
- 5.Carefully pour more water onto the soil.

Top Tip:

Water the soil everyday to help your sunflower grow.



How To Make Fruit Pizzas

1.Place 4 biscuits on the plate.

You will need:

•4 Digestive biscuits

•Natural yoghurt

e.g. apple, banana,

2. Evenly spread the yoghurt onto each biscuit. $\cdot 3 - 4$ different types of 3. Cautiously cut up the fruit into small pieces.

What to do:

(Ask a grown up to help you when using the sharp knife.)

4.Put the fruit on top of the yoghurt.

•Plate

•Spreading knife
